Reflections from Father Tom

Voice in the Desert

Kierkegaard, one of the modern existentialistic philosophers, narrates 'a story of a clown who was on a tour with his circus group. The preparation was grand and the circus was about to begin. Soon there broke out a fire in the camp. The clown went out to announce to the audience about the fire and asked them to take security measures. But the people just laughed the more serious he got about the fire more they laughed. He warned the people again, but nobody took him seriously. Being a clown, the people took his words for fun. But in reality the fire spread out more quickly than expected with disastrous consequences'.

This is exactly what happened when the John the Baptist preached to the people. They looked at the messenger not the message. As Jesus himself said, "John came neither eating nor drinking and they said, 'He is possessed by a demon'. The son of Man came eating and drinking, and they said 'Look, he is a glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax- collectors and sinners.' (Mt 11:17-18)". People judged John the Baptist by his costumes (appearance) more than by his message and they thought he was a clown. Jesus was judged by his association rather than the truth in his message. Similar to the story above, we sometimes take the prophets and religion as clowns. Kierkagaard was actually depicting the present religious situation of the world. He saw how secularism was rampant and religious values undermined in the society. He saw a society that was consumed by consumerism and confused with conflicting values. Religious leaders seem to lose their credibility with the result that they often are considered as the clowns. People do not take them seriously when important message are communicated. Leaders' visions and missions become meaningless without faith.

The Gospel message reflects the similar message that I have mentioned above. John the Baptist said, "I am the voice of one crying out in the desert, 'make straight the way of the Lord'. He acknowledged who he was and who he was not. He said he was just the voice; and the one to come was mightier than he. How do we listen to the voice of John and how do we prepare for Christmas? So let us make our spiritual path straight with faith as our light.
