Reflections from Father Tom



Feast of Pentecost

The Greek word, Pentecost means 50th Day from the great festival of Passover. It is one of the three festivals listed in the book of Exodus (23:14-17) where it is simply called 'Harvest Festival or the feast of the first-fruits of the grain harvest'. Following the tradition of Abel, people of Israel celebrated the 'offering' of the first fruits of their labor to the altar of God.

This feast of Pentecost is mentioned in the New Testament more frequently than in Old Testament. It is closely connected to the event of the descending of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles. This is the day we celebrate the birth of the Church as the disciples come out of their fear to proclaim the Good News of Jesus to the people of every nation. All become 'One' in the Spirit that everyone could understand the language of love that the Apostles were speaking with the Spirit. "For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, slaves or free persons, and we were all given to drink of one Spirit." (1 Cor. 12:13)

Reflecting on the Feast of Pentecost today, it will be a very enriching experience in our spiritual life to see the 'Greatest gifts' of the Holy Spirit. As the people of Old Testament celebrated the 'Offering' of their first Fruits of their labor, we as people of faith should celebrate the 'Offering' to God in the form of our time, talents and treasure. Every thing we have is from God. And we need to show the gratitude to God by our 'spirit of giving'. God does not need our gifts, as He is the author of everything we have. But He expects us to show the spirit of gratitude for the gifts we have received from Him. Such celebration of our 'offering to God' leads us to true Christian life.

The Spirit that Jesus gives us brings two fruits: Peace and Forgiving. "Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.' And when He had said this, He breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained.' (Jn.20:22-23) As the fruit of the Spirit Jesus gave them Peace. This peace is born of out of Unity and Love. Then He breathed on them 'to go forth and forgive the sins of the people.' As the Apostles were with fear and anger about how Jesus was killed, Jesus gives them the Spirit to forgive the people who harmed them and bring peace among them and then take such a peace to all over the world. So this day should be the 'World Peace Day and World Forgiveness Day".

Prayer: Lord, give us the spirit of forgiveness that we will harvest peace! Amen.
