

# **Reflections from Father Tom**

### The Feast of Body and Blood of Christ

St. Paul writing to the Corinthians expresses how we participate in one body of Jesus by drinking from one cup and breaking one bread. As I mentioned last week, unity and oneness are the constant struggles in the society today. Are we united? Are we members of the one body, Jesus? These are the questions that pop up in our mind. Being in one body of Christ does not mean that we need to have uniformity but unity of our hearts. The body has different parts and each of them assigned to do their duties. We have our hands to share and shake hands with others. And we have legs to walk with the needy as Jesus would do. Eyes are to see others' struggle and ears are to hear the troubles of poor. The normal function of the whole body depends on the various functions of different parts of our body. If the eyes are to say that 'we cannot see any longer and we are going to start hearing', there will be a confusion and chaos. In the organization of our body, the respective parts need to do their duty.

The analogy of body to any community is so meaningful and powerful. You may like to read St. Paul's letter to Corinthians 12:3-14 where he speaks about the one body and having many parts in unity. The community of faith is like the body. We come to gather to celebrate that oneness every time we come to Church acknowledging each one's different gifts and ministries. As God designed our human body with different parts for their special functions of our body, we the member of Body of Christ, are called by the same spirit for the various ministries or functions of our one Church. Some time we may get carried away with the idea of oneness and ownership by interfering in others' special ministries. Imagine what will happen if the ears are trying to take the job of eating instead of the mouth. The ears still argue that they are also important parts of the body and have every right to taste the food and why always the mouth. For the normal function of our body we need to let the parts do their work in different ways under the instruction of the brain. The unity of our bodily function cannot be in the uniformity of their performance but in the diversity of their function with the spirit of unity. So let us be united in the same Lord with our different ministers inspired by the one Spirit.



Speaking about the body and blood of Christ, I would like to mention here about the devotion to the Blessed Sacrament of Holy Eucharist. We come to celebrate and express our faith in Eucharistic Jesus. You and I know through our faith that what we receive is not a mere piece of bread but the

body and blood of Christ. Don't we think we need to speak to Jesus through prayer, as we feel he comes into our hearts? The praying community is always the growing community, as the Apostles were united in prayer.

May the Eucharist Lord bless you and your families!
