Reflection from Father Tom

May they rest in Peace!

November is the month during which we remember our beloved ones who have gone to eternal rest. We, as followers of Christ, believe there is life after this life on earth. Jesus revealed the truth and he promised to us that we would live because of our faith, though we have to leave our body, a tent - as St. Paul mentions, " For we know that if the earthly tent we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, an eternal house in heaven, not built by human hands" (2Cor:5:1). This brings us the hope to proceed in our daily life, consciously and constantly preparing for the eternal life to come.

How can we make our beloved ones live among us? God give them life eternal. How can we make their memories live among us? My memories go back to my younger days. Some good priests might have taught the people of our village a beautiful custom. During the month of November each family would invite two or three poorest of the poor people. The family would give them a very good dinner and present them brand new clothing. It is not what they gave that impressed me, but the way the family presented the gift to the poorest of the poor made a great impression on me as a young child. After the dinner the family would kneel before the guest as if the guest is representing the beloved one who passed away, and presented the gift after a short prayer. The guest in return promised to pray for the departed ones.

This taught me the human values behind the beautiful custom. In the today's world of 'Consumerism', the values of human life are ignored or sidelined. Our modern computerized life may make us insensitive to the feelings and needs of our families. I am not against modern machines, but I am concerned that many of us work and live like machines. In this modern culture we may tend to forget our loved ones who have gone before us. They were real human beings, not a 'computer' gone dead. They gave us this life. They touched our life. Let us remember them.

How can we meaningfully remember our beloved ones today? I hope this story that I have mentioned above helps us find a way to remember your departed mom or dad or our family members well. One of the oldest customs in our Catholic Church was to offer Masses for the intention of your beloved ones, which helped to support the missionaries. So, we might start the custom of helping a poor family and support the world missions in memory of our dear ones. May they rest in Peace!

Social Ministry

2018 CRS Rice Bowl Grant - St Margaret Mary's Parish was once again the recipient of a \$800 grant from Catholic Relief Services (CRS).

Remember the Lenten Rice Bowl program sponsored by the Catholic Relief Services (CRS)? Each year, CRS returns 25% of the collected donations to the Archdiocese to help combat hunger in local communities.

Members of St. Margaret Mary donated to this effort during Lent (the little cardboard boxes). The parish applied for and received an \$800.00 grant from this effort. The parish in collaboration with PRISM (local food shelf) will use the grant money to fight children's hunger especially when school is not in session and free and reduced lunches are not available. During Spring 2019 there will be emphasis on collecting money and easy-to-prepare foods (peanut butter, macaroni and cheese, tuna, etc) to donate to PRISM.

Thank you for your past and future support to help those who have less.
