Reflection from Father Tom

Come, Lord Jesus!

Every celebration is meaningful and successful when we are duly prepared. Christmas is the most important festival next to Easter in our Christian tradition. This important festival requires serious preparation not by mere shopping. Therefore, we have the season of Advent. The word 'Advent' is derived from two Latin words: 'ad' and 'venire', which means 'to come'. So Advent is the time we prepare to celebrate the coming of Jesus into this world as a child.

Advent is also time that Jesus is knocking and waiting at the door of our hearts to come in, at our invitation. Whenever we call, 'Come, Lord Jesus,' he readily comes into our hearts to make His home. When Jesus comes, he is not going to turn our hearts into restful retreats. He will transform them into a sort of "house" of action, filling them with our adventurous spiritual life. So, we are called to an "Adventurous Advent," turning to God from our derailed lives.

Advent invites deeper introspection of ourselves. Are our lives worthy enough to have Jesus born into our hearts? This is the time of active waiting and adventurous fighting against evil with our spiritual gifts from God. As St. Paul writes, "It is the hour now for you to awake from sleep. For our salvation is nearer now than when we first believed; the night is advanced, the day is at hand. Let us then throw off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light; let us conduct ourselves properly as in the day, not in orgies and drunkenness, not in promiscuity and lust, not in rivalry and jealousy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the desires of the flesh."

This is the time to put on Jesus Christ with reverence not with rivalry; with love not with lust; with joy not with jealousy; with promises not promiscuity. Let us hear Jesus' message for this season: "Be sure of this: if the master of the house had known the hour of night when the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and not let his house be broken into. So too, you also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come."

So let us genuinely prepare ourselves for the joy of Christmas! Wishing you all a Happy Advent Season!
