Reflection from Father Tom

Lent – A Time for Mercy

Last week we reflected on the story of the 'Prodigal Son' through which Jesus explained to the Pharisees and scribes that the Heavenly Father is kind and forgiving. And we are called to be ministers of reconciliation in the community in which we live. (St. Paul). This week we read the story of the woman caught in adultery. The Pharisees brought this woman to Jesus to test him. If Jesus were to say to the Pharisees that they should let her go, then they could accuse him of not following the Law of Moses. If he were to tell them to stone the woman to death, then they could blame him that he was cruel and not following his own teaching of forgiveness. However, Jesus ignored them by his writing on the ground. Since the Pharisees were persistent in their demand, Jesus placed a prerequisite to judge and condemn the woman.

"Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." Jesus knew that everyone who was eager to punish this woman, a sinner. Indeed, none has escaped from the snares of sin. So, everyone left without stoning the woman to death. Then he said to the woman, "Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin anymore." By these words Jesus showed us his very purpose of his incarnation: that he came to save, not to condemn. If all of us were to have the similar approach to the sinners and to those who have hurt us, like Jesus who generously forgave the woman, then this world would be a better place for our spiritual growth. Mercy is what God wants from us. Let us show mercy to others so that God will be merciful to us.

Unjust Punishment: The Pharisees wanted to condemn this woman caught in adultery quoting the Law of Moses. In the book of Leviticus and Deuteronomy (Lev: 20:10 and Dt 22:22), it is mentioned that both the man and woman should be punished with death for their sins of adultery. But the Pharisees brought only the woman, not the man. Jesus sees the misogyny and discrimination against woman while leaving the man off the hook.

Neither do I Condemn: I do get this question in my mind. Jesus said, "Let the one who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her", then 'why didn't he throw the first stone at her?' as he was the only one there without sin. He did not do it, because He is full of love and forgiveness. If Jesus himself did and does not condemn us, then how can we condemn or judge others? Don't we think we need to put our hands in our chest to reflect our unworthiness before pointing our fingers at others? Lent is the time during which we reflect on our own life and repent for our sins and look forward to God's mercy. It is not the time to catch sinners and bring them before Jesus for judgment. But it is the time to pray for God's mercy for our sins as we show mercy to others. The story in the Gospel today explains how Jesus dealt with the woman caught in adultery and the people who brought her for condemnation.

Jesus said to them, "Amen, I say to you, tax collectors and prostitutes are entering the kingdom of God before you, 'hypocrites'(Mt:21:31).

God, give me the wisdom not to judge but the strength to forgive others. Amen
