Baptism of the Lord

This year, as Christmas and New Year were on Sunday, we celebrated the Solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord on last Monday as per the liturgical calendar. However, the reading this weekend calls for the same theme of Baptism. As our Baptism pivots the core of our life's existence, I would like to focus on the very important sacrament of Initiation.

We may wonder and ask the question: why did Jesus let himself be baptized? He needed no baptism, no repentance, since he was without sin. No wonder John the Baptist was surprised: I have to be baptized by you, and yet you have come to me (Mt. 3.14). Jesus wanted to show his solidarity with all of humanity, to associate himself fully with all that is human except sin. It was an act of self-abasement. Actually Jesus' baptism foretells his own death, his resurrection and the descent of the Holy Spirit, as John writes, "He will baptize with the Holy Spirit and fire." Jesus' baptism was a baptism unto suffering and death. His baptism was to tell us of Jesus' mission in the world. "The spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord."(Lk. 4:18-19). Luke rightly puts this passage right after Jesus' baptism.

As Jesus was called, "this is my beloved son" when he was baptized, we have become the beloved sons and daughters of God through our own baptism. We put on Christ and become a new creation in Christ. Through baptism we enter into the life of grace. We also become the light of the world by proclaiming the gospel to our family members and the poor who are in need. Baptism is not merely a naming ceremony. By baptism we are called to the mission of Christ. We are commissioned to proclaim the glad tidings to our brothers and sisters. Only by responding to the call of God that we received through the sacrament of Baptism, we will be called 'the beloved sons and daughters of God'. May the Spirit of the Lord be upon us to guide us to bring the glad tidings to our children and the poor!

Come, O Holy Spirit, and fill our hearts with the fire of love. Amen.
