## Reflection from Father Tom

### Easter and Evangelization

The Holy week ends with the solemn celebration of Easter which is the greatest festival of our Christian Faith. Easter is the reminder of what we shall be after this earthly life of struggles and challenges. Jesus says, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me" (John 14:6). When Jesus said 'I am the Way,' he meant that the way to heaven is to carry our crosses and to imitate him. He could have shown His 'Way' to heaven in any different way. But he had chosen the 'way of the cross' to cross the valley of death by setting an example for us. This means we are called to take our crosses and follow him to be qualified for the gift of salvation from God. Easter is not a mere historical event that happened two thousand years ago, but it is the event that happens every day in our life by carrying our crosses and caring for one another:(care and carry).

The time of Easter is to free us from the fear of death and focus on the resurrection of our life here on earth and the life to come. This feast gives us hope through our faith in Jesus. When we find ourselves amid despair, Easter fills our hearts with hope of victory and salvation. Easter reminds us, as Christ came out the tomb to life, we should come out of various 'tombs' we are buried in: fear, despair, unforgiveness, sloth, gluttony, selfishness, pride, ego-centeredness, greed, lack of love for others, etc. Are we ready to come out of our 'tombs' to taste the life of resurrection?

Easter is the festival of our victory over death that we gained by the death and resurrection of Jesus. That joy will never be completed until we share the joy with others. That is why Jesus, before he was taken up to heaven, said to the disciples, "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age" (Matthew 28:19-20). These are the final verses of Matthew gospel which summarize the whole mission of Christ and the purpose of his incarnation. We are called to continue the work of Jesus by our life of resurrection in this world. We, as the community of St. Margaret Mary, are happy to welcome the Moore family into our Faith in the resurrected Jesus by fulfilling his commandments of preaching.
