

Reflection from Father Tom

Baptism of the Lord

Though this year the feast of Baptism of the Lord was scheduled last Monday which went unnoticed, I could not but write this week on this important feast in the life of our spiritual journey. As His baptism was the beginning of his public ministry, our baptism is the beginning of our Christian life.

We may wonder and ask the question: why did Jesus let himself be baptized? He needed no baptism, no repentance, since he was without sin. No wonder John the Baptist was surprised and said to Jesus: "I have to be baptized by you, and yet you have come to me" (Mt. 3:14). By his baptism, Jesus wanted to show his solidarity with all of humanity, to associate himself fully with all that is human except sin. The very fact of the Incarnation of Jesus is to live like humans in all things except sin. It was his act of self-abasement to his Heavenly Father.

Indeed, Jesus' baptism foretold his own death, his resurrection, and the descent of the Holy Spirit, as John writes, "*He will baptize with the Holy Spirit and fire.*"

"Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?" (Rom: 6:3). Jesus' baptism was a baptism unto suffering and death.

His baptism was to tell us of Jesus' mission in the world. "*The spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord.*" (Lk. 4:18-19). St. Luke rightly puts this passage, quoting from prophet Isaiah, right after Jesus' baptism. We receive the same spirit on the day of baptism and confirmation to continue the mission of Christ: proclaiming liberty to the captives of our selfishness and sin, recovery from our blind-eye to our suffering brothers and sisters and letting our freedom flow like a river by our holiness.

As Jesus was called, "this is my beloved son" when he was baptized, we have become the beloved sons and daughters of God through our own baptism. We put on Christ and become a new creation in Christ. Through baptism we enter into the life of grace. We also become the light of the world by proclaiming the gospel to our family members and the poor who are in need. Baptism is not merely a naming ceremony. By baptism we are called to the mission of Christ. We are commissioned to proclaim the glad tidings to our brothers and sisters. Only by responding to the call of God that we received through the sacrament of Baptism, we will be called 'the beloved sons and daughters of God'. May the Spirit of the Lord be upon us to guide us to bring the glad tidings to our children and the poor!

Come, O Holy Spirit, and fill our hearts with the fire of love. Amen.

Message from Joe Gindele

Over 72 billion dollars in unclaimed funds is being held in states in the U.S. (over \$600 million in MN alone). About 1 in 7 American adults have money owed to them but they are unaware of it. The average find is \$892. This is a FREE and legitimate undertaking. Type a/your name into these U.S. government websites, "MissingMoney.com" and "Unclaimed.org" to see if any of these funds belong to your, your family or friends. Check these sites a few times per year as they are regularly updated. Check out other states as well, since we are a mobile society; this can be done easily with one click. If you are lucky in finding funds (you claim it through your respective state; in MN it's the Dept. of Commerce in St. Paul) you might decide to donate some to SMM. Your tax preparer, librarian, police and attorney will all vouch for its legitimacy and free service. Find *your* missing money, *hidden in plain sight*.
