

Reflection from Father Tom

How to Detract our Distraction?

We live a busy life. As St. Paul writes in the second reading, we are ‘anxious and filled with distraction’. Our minds are like a ‘grand central station’. We are forced to keep up the fast paces of our life. We are conditioned by the societal lifestyle. The consumerist corporate world, with their bombarding commercials, dictates what we should like and what we should buy. The companies design how we should dress and what we should eat. A human person in the modern world has become a mere number among the billions. We have lost our uniqueness in this speedy world with economies of scale. We lose our wings in the winds of this worldly business. We may not have time to stop to ‘smell’ the ‘roses’. Many times, we are confused to know the ‘season’ we experience in our spiritual life. In such a time we need the ‘desert’ experience to know about ourselves.


In the past, the sages and spiritual masters went to forests and the deserts to contemplate on their life. They did not go to New York ‘Times Square’ to meditate. They did not go to the great libraries to read the books. But they wanted to read about their lives and wrote the books for libraries with their ‘desert’ experiences. The greatest knowledge they were after, was their ‘knowledge about their self’. They became masters of spirituality by mastering themselves. This was possible for them when they retreated themselves and brought to their inner awareness by fighting against their inner enemies. We all need to have such a ‘desert experience’ to discover ourselves and thus could manage and build spiritual immunity to the ‘various seasonal problems’ of our spiritual life. To win the temptations of our life we get strength by these prayerful experiences.

The whole cosmos moves in a cyclic fashion and so does our life. As we go through the four seasons in a year, (maybe only two seasons in Minnesota) we also go through various ‘seasons’ in our spiritual life. There are days we feel the ‘Spring’ and some days the ‘Winter’ and may experience the ‘Fall’ and we see the ‘Summer’. One day is bright and another day could be dark. It is amazing to see the influences of the cosmic cyclic realities in our daily life. To cope with the changes in the seasons, our body, by nature, makes adjustments so that we survive with good health. But to cope with the spiritual or emotional ‘seasonal changes’, our souls should be seasoned with our ‘desert experience’ so

that we could master these changes to bring good balance without spiritual distractions.

Lord, please give us the wisdom to slow down our life’s ‘speed’ so that we will be able to avoid the accidents of our spiritual life. Amen.
