Reflection from Father Tom

Transfiguration and Transformation

The gospel today narrates the story of Jesus' transfiguration on the mountain. The disciples were excited about this unique experience, but could not understand what Jesus wanted to communicate to them through this instance. While Jesus wanted to explain to them through his transfiguration the glorification of every believer after death, the disciples were questioning what "rising from the dead" meant. Jesus teaches us today that 'Death' is the way to glorification and He is the way through whom we reach that glorification through our transfiguration that happens on our death.

The story of Jesus' transfiguration is a foretaste of our glorification after death. It is a reminder to all of us to transform our lives so we will be with Jesus with 'dazzling clothes' in heaven. And we could say along with Peter, "Rabbi, it is good that we are here". And God would say to us, "This is my beloved son/daughter in whom I am well pleased".

This needs our faith and commitment to follow Jesus and to transform our life of sin to a life of holiness. The call to holiness of our life is the central theme of the Lenten season. At the end of Lent we need to check ourselves, how well we have transformed to celebrate Easter, which is our Passover from sin to Holiness. Let us faithfully follow Jesus to understand the meaning of death and rising to life, and to learn to live a life, filled with hope, led by faith, and energized in love.

Prayer: Transform us, O Lord, that we will be transfigured in your presence to the endless Joy of eternal life. Amen.
