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Reflection from Father Tom

God's House Is Not a Marketplace

In the world of commercialism, this weekend's Gospel reading sheds light on the truth for our personal reflection. In the long history of human life, people have been influenced by various philosophies like pragmatism, idealism, existentialism, etc. But in recent years we are knowingly or unknowingly guided or misguided by a new philosophy of commercialism. Though, none has been the direct proponent of this philosophy, but we have adopted it in our daily life by the clandestine influence of 'great marketing' science and the strategies of selling. Modern consumers are conditioned by tactics of marketing strategies and made to think that they are the 'little gods' of the malls. In other words, the modern consumers are made 'kings and queens' within their own selfish 'boxes'.

This dangerous self-centered consumerism has led the people to a modern form of what is called Epicureanism and Utilitarianism: people become merely 'end users' of products rather than producers. Likes and dislikes of the consumer become the moral code of our society. It is sad to see that such philosophical notions have crept into our families and church communities even without being realized by many of us.

A consumer goes to the market to see what he or she can get to please themselves. He/she is not going there to show the spirit of commitment or give a great sacrifice of love, but to get something. If he/she is not satisfied with the goods then he/she goes to another store. This may be all right with material things. But when it creeps into families and communities, we are in danger of what Jesus is talking about in the gospel today, "Take these out of here, and stop making my Father's house a marketplace." Our body is the temple of the Holy Spirit, as St. Paul writes, "Do you not know that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have received from God, and that you are not your own" 1Cor:6:19.

When we are looking for our families and communities merely to get something to gratify us, then we are making God's temple, which is our body, a marketplace. When a husband or wife is looking for something to receive without giving, then he/she is making the family a 'marketplace'. We cannot make our home or church a marketplace where we only 'get' something to gratify us as 'end-users'. Rather, we learn to enjoy sacrificial giving. Our families should be founded on the

sound sacrifices for one another. Our human body is the 'temple of the Holy Spirit', so we cannot make it a marketplace by 'selling' it for mere sensual pleasures.

Lord, help us to make our body, family and community as your sanctum sanctorum of your presence among us where we find love, justice, peace and forgiveness. Amen.
