Reflection from Father Tom

Father's Day

Since, during the summer we publish our parish bulletin fortnightly, I have to write wishing all fathers a Happy Father's Day in advance. So, this week, my column reflects on Father's Day.

In the Old Testament, we see the prophets speaking about God as King, warrior, judge, or a taskmaster who would punish the evildoers and save the innocent. However, Jesus gave us the final revelation of God in the New Testament that God is our heavenly FATHER who loves and forgives us. JN: 3:16 "God so loved the world that he gave his only son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." Jesus taught us to call God, "Our Father who art in heaven". God was considered a distant Being in the Old Testament, but Jesus, the Son of God, brought God close to us with the correct concept of Fatherhood. In the New Testament, God is no longer a transcendental reality beyond comprehension, but a tangible truth in our daily life. God is our Father who loves us every day and forgives us every time we turn to him (ref. The story of the prodigal son: Luke: 15:11ff).

God is the creator and he is described as **protector and provider** to all creatures. So, following this construct, in every family a father is known traditionally as the one who protects and provides for the family. The modern understanding of the word 'protector' not only means the physical and material protection, but also it means protecting the spiritual values, as the father is the first teacher of faith to his child/children. The fathers have the responsible duty to protect their children from the dangers in their life, not only by words but also by their exemplary life.

A father is a **provider** does not mean merely that he is a material provider, but he, along with his wife, provides a family of love to their children. It may not be an exaggeration, if I were to state that many of the social problems our children are facing today is due to the unstable home they come from. The home is the first university where the children learn to love, moral values, and develop social skills/behaviors. If the homes are broken into pieces, then the learning or the desired modification of behaviors may not take place in the minds of our children. As we celebrate 'Father's Day' I invite all the fathers to reflect on what kind of fathers we are to our children? And as the sons and daughters of our fathers, how have we respected and loved our fathers?

Father's Day is not only reminding the responsibilities of the fathers, it primarily reminds the obligation of the children to their fathers. Father's Day should not be the only time in the year we appreciate our fathers, who were instrumental in giving us life. We are to be grateful to them all through our life for the sacrifices they made for us. Father's Day is a reminder to thank our

fathers in a special way. We read in the book of Sirach: 3:1-16. "*He who honors his father atones for sins... he who honors his father is gladdened by children and when he prays, he is heard. He who reveres his father will live a long life ...he who fears the Lord honors his father and serves his parents as rulers. In word and deed honor your father and his blessings may come upon you; for a father's blessing gives a family firm roots, but a mother's curse uproots the growing plant. Glory not in your father's shame, for his shame is no glory to you! My son, take care of your father when he is old; grieve him not as long as he lives. Even if his mind fails, be considerate with him; revile him not in the fullness of your strength. For kindness to your father will not be forgotten, it will serve as a sin offering –it will take a lasting root.*" The words of the Bible are very direct about how to treat our parents. The fourth commandment of God tells us the same.

The problem of neglecting parents in their old age is not new in society. It may be getting worse as lives today get busy and we may take things for granted more and more. We all need to be concerned about the future if it takes us away from our family and its values. We need to take care of our parents as they did when we were children. Whatever we do for our parents helps to pay back for the sacrifice they made with love. This kindness will not be forgotten by God. We received life from our parents. May we give the same to the future generation.
