

Reflection from Father Tom

Fear and Freedom

The readings of this weekend and the celebration of July 4th (Our Independence Day) have a common theme we can reflect on in the coming weeks: Fear and Freedom.

There is a constant conflict between ‘Fears of the Flesh’ and ‘Freedom of Faith.’ Our fears take away the ‘gears’ of our life that our life engines run at high RPM going nowhere. Fear filled with the passions of our flesh push us down, whereas the power of Faith pulls us up. Many of us are torn between these forces. We are aware that the emotions of the flesh lead us to fall. But the freedom of Faith guides us to gain the eternal truth, because “we walk by faith, not by sight” as St. Paul writes to the Corinthians (1Cor. 5:7).

The disciples, in the Gospel narration of today, were filled with a similar fear of the flesh that “A violent squall came up and waves were breaking over the boat, so that it was already filling up. (Mk. 4: 37) The fear of death was more powerful in them than their faith in Jesus. They have been blinded by the fear of the flesh and they have forgotten to have faith in Jesus, the Master of the universe, who was just sleeping in their boat. “He woke up, rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, “Quiet! Be still!” The wind ceased and there was a great calm. Then he asked them, “Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?” (Mk. 4: 39-10)

This is exactly what St. Paul writes in the second reading today, “Consequently, from now on we regard no one according to the flesh; even if we once knew Christ according to the flesh, yet now we know him so no longer. So, whoever is in Christ is a new creation: the old things have passed away; behold, new things have come.” (2Cor. 5: 15 -17) We are called to move on to ‘new things’ of freedom through our faith, from the ‘old thing’ of our fear of the flesh.

Prayer: Lord, while the ‘Fears of the unknown’ torture my mind, set the torch of faith in my heart, to lead me from the darkness of fear to the light of freedom in truth. Amen.

Our Freedom is to Serve the Nation

St. Paul’s letter to Galatians (Gal: 5: 13-18) explains about true freedom. Those words of St. Paul is more appropriate for our reflection during this

week as we celebrate Independence Day. “*For you were called for freedom, brothers and sisters. But do not use this freedom as an opportunity for the flesh; rather serve one another through love.*”

As sons and daughters of God we are called to live in freedom not with fear. Our ancestors fought for the great freedom we enjoy today. But the way we sometimes live may exhibit that we might have used our freedom as an opportunity to take advantage of selfish causes and may get enslaved to the concept of misconceived freedom ‘into fragments by narrow domestic walls.’ That is why St. Paul reminds us, as he wrote to Galatians, that freedom is not an opportunity for the flesh but for the service of others with love. National freedom is not for one’s selfishness but for the welfare of the nation. We, citizens of free America, are called in freedom to serve one another with love in gratitude to our ancestors who made many sacrifices for our freedom.

*Where the mind is led forward by thee
Into ever-widening thought and action
Into that heaven of freedom, my Father, let my
country awake. (R. Tagore)*
