


Reflection from Father Tom

Modern-Day Shepherding

Shepherding or leading a community of people has never been easy in the long history of our life. It is much more challenging in the modern times with the advent of information technology and spirit of individualism and freedom. Knowledge and freedom are tools of leadership as well as its challenge. The work of a leader is to navigate the means and ways efficiently to effectively attain the goals.

Parenting is Shepherding: As parents of our children, we are also called to lead or shepherd our children in the right path. I hear, now and then, from the parents that parenting was easier in the past compared to the present time. As I mentioned before, leading others is challenging in modern times, but we know that parenting our children is rewarding as well as demanding. It makes it more meaningful when we realize that God called us for this great vocation of shepherding. As we hear from the first reading of today from prophet Jeremiah that God appoints us to continue to take care of our children and the people in the community. “I will appoint shepherds for them who will shepherd them so that they need no longer fear and tremble; and none shall be missing, says the LORD.” (Jer.23:4)

Along with the psalmist we need to constantly believe in God to gain more strength in leading our wards. *“The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing we shall want...He guides me in the right paths for his name’s sake. Even though I walk in the dark valley I fear no evil; for you are at my side with your rod and your staff that give me strength.”* These are the strengthening words of God in this time of ever-growing communities.

Let us always trust in God. The works that we do by shepherding others are not for our glory but that His name be known to people. He is our supreme Shepherd. Let us move forward as He guides in the valleys to the verdant pastures to refresh our souls (Ps 23). He is God of love and he will never desert us. Let the compassionate words of Jesus linger in our minds when we are weary and beaten down, *“When he (Jesus) disembarked and saw the vast crowd, his heart was moved with pity for them, for they were like sheep without a shepherd; and he began to teach them many things (Mk:6:34).”*

Loving God, lead us and guide us to the restful waters! Amen.
