Reflection from Father Tom

Labor Day

In his letter to Thessalonians St. Paul writes, “*In fact, when we were with you, we instructed you that if anyone was unwilling to work, neither should that one eat. We hear that some are conducting themselves among you in a disorderly way, by not keeping busy but minding the business of others.*” As a matter of fact, St. Paul worked hard, beside his challenging and demanding mission work, for his food so that he could be an example to others. He never wished to be a burden to the people for his basic needs, though he deserved to receive from them for his dedicated labor for them.

Work- Continuation of God’s Creative work: In Genesis, the first book of the Bible, we read that God worked for six days to bring out this orderly creation from the chaos and took rest on the 7th day. The six days of God’s work was not finished on the 7th day but continues to eternity through every human being. Through God’s creative work he sanctified our labor. Our labor is the continuation of God’s creation. God created us in his own image and gave his spirit that we continue to be *pro-creators* by participating in the creative work of God in this world. So, everyone has a role to play in the world of natural order and is responsible for the creation of God. So, our labor is not a burden but a divine opportunity to be part of God’s continued creative work.

Idle Mind: We are commissioned by God to continue his creative work with joy of Godly labor. Our work is not a punishment but a privilege of being God’s instrument of creation because God continues to create through every one of us. The failure to work is walking away from God’s presence and refusal to participate in God’s creative work. Thus, evil gets into our mind. That is why we have the saying, “An idle mind is the devil’s workshop.

Being busy to avoid troubles: This is what happened in the community of Thessalonians, instead of participation in the creative work of God they were idle and minding the business of the other people. If we are to be busy and work harder to do good, we will not have enough time to do anything bad.

The yearly Labor Day celebration is a reminder to all of us that our work is the continuation of God’s creative work and we are pro-creators. This is the time we appreciate one another for the great sacrifice and contribution we make to bring this world

livable to all creatures and lovable in the eye of God. As St. Paul mentions in the second reading today, “He willed to give us birth by the word of truth that we may be a kind of first fruits of his creatures” by participating in his work of creation through our productive labor.

Prayer: *Lord, we are not the Master builders, but called to build this world with your ‘master plan’ of our salvation. So let us add my ‘bricks’ to your ‘building’ with simple faith in a humble way. Amen.*

May God bless you for your great work! Thank you for your great sacrifices for our community of faith!
