Reflection from Father Tom

Servant Leader

Leadership in modern times is becoming more and more challenging than in the past, due the advent of Internet and Information Technologies. It seems that the followers of today, because of the availability of abundant knowledge, can challenge the leaders. But when knowledge refuses to become wisdom with humility, it could be blinded with pride. That is why; Jesus says in the Gospel today, "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all." Only by serving others, we can become leaders, as Jesus brought salvation by his dying on the cross. We are called to serve to lead; and lead to serve. One who is humble in heart and simple in mind becomes the greatest leader, not by his/her self-proclamation, but by her/his profound service to others.

One of the greatest passions of our life is to be the greatest and to have control over others. This has its origin from our pride and self-importance. As St. James states in the second reading of today that where such selfish ambitions exist, there we find disorder and every foul practice. Even the Apostles had a similar problem of wishing to be the greatest while following the humblest Jesus. The core revelation of God through the incarnation of Jesus, as we know, was that 'the highest Heaven' came down with humility to die on the cross that we will be lifted to heaven. Jesus constantly reminds us that we can be the first only when we are the least of all and by being the servant of all. This may sound paradoxical to us. But the truth is that we are not the Masters but mere followers.

It is by emptying ourselves we become rich; by losing, we gain life; by giving, we receive; by dying we live; and by sharing we multiply our joy.

Prayer: Lead us Lord, though the struggles of our life and bruises of our service that we may become leaders by our imitation of you. Amen!
