


Reflection from Father Tom

Servant Leader

A couple of months ago, we had a similar theme in focusing on my column here: If we wish to be the greatest, we must serve others. Christ became our redeemer by being servant and sacrifice for us on the cross. "Whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all". Jesus' life and his words are so clear to us that he came to the world to serve and not be served. He mentions in the gospel reading today that one should be a slave if he/she wishes to be first. It may sound paradoxical, but it is the perfect way to paradise. Jesus exemplified this way to paradise by washing the feet of his disciples.

Even Jesus' disciple could not understand this paradoxical truth of being a slave to be the greatest. He, again and again, emphasized the true greatness does not emanate from power of crown, prestige, or authority. But 'Being Great' comes from the humble service we can offer to others. He preached this challenging concept of his ultimate teaching as he predicted his death and suffering to his disciples who found it hard to understand and learn. It was not merely the problem of the disciple of the past. It is indeed challenging for us even after two thousand years of our Christian learning and living.

In the leadership courses of today, we may come across the concept of 'servant leadership', which means the leader of an organization should be a servant who will be ready to serve the organization and the employees. He/she is expected to model the way to his/her fellow employees. Even the modern sales technique calls to focus on the method of 'consultative selling,' which is focused on serving or helping the customer to get the best product for their money. All these modern theories of our daily life or business are derived from our Lord Jesus who humbled himself as a slave and died for our salvation.

As followers of Jesus, we need to imitate his principle of 'servant leader' to guide our children and those who are under our care.

Prayer: *Lord, give me the pride of being your humble servant. Amen*
