## Reflection from Father Tom

### Advent: Preparing with Love

With Advent we begin the new liturgical year. Advent is the celebration of waiting for the coming of our Lord Jesus. The word ‘Advent’ is derived from two Latin words, ‘ad’ and ‘venire’, which means ‘to come’. So, Advent is the season of Jesus’ coming into our life. This is a waiting filled with love for Jesus. As St. Paul says in his first letter to the Thessalonians, “*May the Lord make you increase and abound in love for one another and for all, just as we have for you, so as to strengthen your hearts,*” it is the love for Jesus that makes us wait for him. That love for Him should be realized in our love for one another.

Waiting for someone can be tiresome and tedious. But when we wait with love, it makes the waiting joyful. It is like a lover waiting for his/her beloved to come home from a long journey. Here with great love, we are waiting for Jesus, our dearly beloved, to come into our hearts.

This waiting for Jesus should be filled with faith, hope, and love. Jesus’ presence in our home makes us joyful. This joy is also realized in our waiting for him. This waiting should not be idle but should be active with spirited preparation. As we would prepare our house to receive a distinguished guest, we should prepare our hearts with vigilant prayer, as Jesus tells us in the Gospel today. “Be vigilant at all times and pray that you have the strength.”

*Prayer: Come Lord Jesus! Lord Jesus, come! And make our hearts your home! Amen.*

### History of the Advent Wreath

The origin of the Advent Wreath can be traced back to pre-Christian Germanic cultures who would light candles during the winter solstice to honor the return of the light. This practice was adopted by Christians in the Middle Ages as a way to mark the season of Advent. The circular shape of the wreath represents eternity, reminding us of God's infinite love and presence in our lives. The greenery used to decorate it symbolizes everlasting life and hope given to us by Jesus. The lighting of the candles sequentially each week provides us with a tangible way to mark the passing of time and encourages us to reflect on the themes of hope, peace, joy and love.

## Advent Reflection Dec 14th

### Advent Afternoon of Reflection

On Saturday, December 14, 2024, from 1:30 pm to 3:30pm, spiritual director David Liedl will be leading an Advent Reflection in Visitation Hall entitled “Rejoice, O Highly Favored: Three Ways to Welcome the Word Made Flesh”. The Advent/Christmas Season celebrates the manifold ways God chooses to live among us, to be for us “Emmanuel.” Our afternoon of reflection explores three ways that enable us to better open ourselves to the Word Made Flesh and deepen our experience of joy, gratitude, and peace. Guiding us to these reflections will be one of Fra Angelico’s masterpieces from the 15<sup>th</sup> century. His painting, The Annunciation, stands at the top of a staircase in the Monastery of San Marco in Florence, Italy. The fresco was intended to inspire the monks of his monastery who walked past this image every day. Come join us as we seek to gather our own treasure of spiritual inspiration from this great work of art and for this great season.

Our reflection leader, David Liedl, was shaped by the spirituality of St. Francis of Assisi having lived for 33 years as a Franciscan brother. In that capacity he served: as a contemplative in the South Bronx, a retreat director in Orlando, and a community leader in Minneapolis. He is a trained spiritual director and provided ministry as a chaplain and Director of Pastoral Care at Catholic Eldercare. The one constant in his varied expressions of ministry is his passion to help people live into the fullness of their spiritual lives. His artistic talents find expression as a musician, poet, photographer, potter, and liturgical artist. He lives in Fridley, has an active practice as a spiritual director, and offers respite care for people living with dementia.
