Reflection from Father Tom

Holy Family

The Sunday after Christmas, we traditionally celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family, as a married couple become a whole family with a child. Jesus, by being born in a family, has honored every family. Pope Francis in his daily message “In imitation of the Holy Family, we are called to rediscover the **educational value** of the family unit founded on the love that always regenerates relationships, opening up horizons of hope.”

The family is the first ‘University’ where everyone learns the great values of life. God plants every one of us in our family that we bloom and grow in maturity of love and forgiveness to have a bonding relationship with one another. If our families and their values were to diminish, that would be the beginning of human disaster. Our family is the nucleus of any civil society. So, everyone has the greatest obligation to provide, preserve and protect the values of our families so that our children will produce the fruits of faith, hope and love.

No one can underestimate the challenges of family life. Those of us who live in families would know more than myself, about the challenges and joys of family life. But those challenges are the basic sources of our life to enrich our love for one another. Every challenge is a chance to grow. Every obstacle is an opportunity to learn. If only we learn the art of changing our ‘head-wind’ of our life into ‘tail-wind,’ our ‘flight of our life’ will gain momentum to be successful.

To accomplish that goal, all of us need to have faith in God and in your spouse, children, and in your family members. This faith starts with a simple practice of prayer. A family that prays together will stay together. Prayer is a spiritual exercise like our physical workout. Our physical exercise of once or twice in a year will not guarantee your good health. But regular physical practice prevents us from sickness. Similarly, prayer prevents us from failures and preserves us in ‘spiritual health’. A one-day walk may not reduce your blood pressure, but persistent practice will do. So constant practice of our prayer-life brings success in our family life. Let our new resolution for this New Year be ‘Family Prayer.’ Prayer brings unity in our family and thus begets victory in our life.

Prayer: *Lord Jesus, as you blessed the Holy Family with your presence, come into our families to bless us and our children! Amen.*
