Reflection from Father Tom

The First Miracle of Jesus


The First miracle at a Wedding feast: Jesus performed many miracles during his ministry. But his first miracle was performed at a wedding feast at Cana. This was not a coincidence. Jesus intended to teach us that every miracle of love begins at home. The Sacrament of Marriage is the beginning of a committed love relationship. The very fact of Jesus' birth in a family reminds us that God honored every family in the world. And the family is the beginning of our journey towards salvation. We experience Jesus' miracle in our children. The first miracle was not merely changing the water into wine; it is the miracle of binding the hearts through the Sacrament of Marriage.

The changing of water into wine symbolizes the prosperity of joy in our family life, as the wine is a sign of prosperity. This miracle reminds us that we should live a joyful life with the spirit of hospitality, welcoming everyone to our family table. In ancient cultures, everyone in the town was invited for a wedding ceremony. Jesus, by changing water into wine, teaches us that if we can change our hearts to a holy life, we will also be able to sit in the heavenly banquet.

In the Second reading of today, St Paul focuses on unity, which happens to be a rare commodity because of the uniqueness of individuals. Every human being is distinctively and uniquely created by God, but not uniformly manufactured like any goods in the factories. The differences between people add flavor to human interaction, thus helping us grow in maturity. The uniqueness of every person helps us attain our spiritual gifts that St. Paul explains in his letter to Corinthians. He enumerates many different gifts from one God. "There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone." (1Cor: 12:4-5) Thus St. Paul reminds us that the differences are not for division, but to challenge us, as followers of Christ, to build the united community of Faith in diversity.

Like any other community, we do face the challenges of unity in our parish family or in our home. In the time of our struggle the words of St. Paul give us direction and solace so that we may be guided by the same Spirit. Let us continue to pray to the God of Unity that the one Spirit, who brings us together as one family of faith, will unite us.

May God bless us with the prosperity of joy in our families!
