Reflection from Father Tom

Time of Lent - A call to Holiness

In the book of Leviticus, we read God commanding Moses and Aaron, “For I, the LORD, am your God; and you shall make and keep yourselves holy, because I am holy.” (Leviticus 11:44) The reason we must be holy is that our Heavenly Father is holy. Holiness is the pathway to heavenly life. If we wish to be reunited with God during and after this earthly life, we must strive to be holy. Through the second reading today, St. Paul calls us to be holy by imitating him, “Join with others in being imitators of me, brothers and sisters, and observe those who thus conduct themselves according to the model you have in us.” (Phil: 3:17)

Way to holiness is an uphill battle. As we struggle to climb higher on the ‘mountain of holiness’, our bodily passions pull us down with ‘earthly gravities’. St. Paul rightly mentions, “Their end is destruction. Their God is their stomach; their glory is in their ‘shame.’ Their minds are occupied with earthly things.” (Phil: 3: 19) Once we strive to be holy, “He will change our lowly body to conform with his glorified body.” (Phil 4:1) To instill the truth of our struggles to climb the ‘mountain of holiness,’ Jesus took his three disciples to the mountain to pray where they could witness the glory of God.

“As they were about to part from him, Peter said to Jesus, “Master, it is good that we are here; let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah.” (Luke: 9:32) It is good to be here on the mountain to see the glory of God and be part of heavenly bliss. However, climbing the ‘mountain of holiness’ is challenging. With the help of Jesus, we could climb the ‘mountain of holiness’ where we will be called the beloved ‘sons and daughters’ of God.

May God be our strength during our struggle to climb the mountain of holiness and be the glory of our Transfiguration! Amen.

Homebound Ministry


