Reflection from Father Tom

Holy Week

Holy week is the special time to celebrate the mysteries of our Christian life. It is not merely the celebration of mysteries of our Christian Faith. Moreover, through these days, in fact, the mystery of our life is celebrated along with the life of Christ.

The celebration of Death and Resurrection of Jesus reminds us that in our life we will not have victory without hard work. We cannot have resurrection without going through the process of death. In short ‘there is no gain without pain.’

Why this week is Holy: This is the holiest season of our sacred liturgy. This time of the week is holy not because it has anything special. But it is called holy week as it makes us holy by inviting us to ponder over the great mystery of death and resurrection of Our Lord, Jesus Christ. It is not mere remembrance of the history but it reflects our life story merging with these mysteries of Jesus. In brief, we make this week holy by making ourselves holy in a special way imitating Jesus’ way of the Cross.

What we do during this week: We began this exercise of holiness with Passion Sunday during which we are reminded of the suffering and death of Jesus for our redemption. On Holy Thursday we solemnly reenact the mystery of the Eucharist and institution of Holy Orders. On Good Friday, we reflect our life story in the light of Jesus’ death on the cross. On Saturday night, we begin our Easter vigil to celebrate our own resurrection from the slavery of sin and fear of death. Thus, during this week, we celebrate our own holy life in the mystery of death and resurrection of Jesus.

How can we make it our own? Eucharist is the source and summit of our faith. The Church invites us to focus on Holy Eucharist, as our Christian life is founded and strengthened by the Eucharist. We are the Eucharistic community. We solemnly believe in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. So, it is needless to say the importance of Eucharist in our life of faith.

I earnestly invite all of you to attend the liturgies during this holy week, which have lots of meaning

to our life. I would like to see the parents bringing the children for the Services. Sometimes our children may grow without knowing the meaning of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, or Easter. It is our duty to teach them by our example.
