## Reflection from Father Tom

### From Tomb to Bloom

“Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the **tomb** first, and he saw and believed” (Jn:20:8). The tomb was empty but the disciples’ hearts were filled with faith. Jesus, by his resurrection, showed that the Cross is the way to cross our valley of death to the mountain of resurrection. That is why it is called Cross. By coming out of the tomb Jesus demonstrated to us that the tomb is the way to bloom in our faith to eternal life. So, by the resurrection of Jesus, we comprehend that there is no more tomb of gloom in our life, but we are called to the life booming with joy.

Easter is not merely a commemoration of the historical event of the past but the celebration of our present life. As Jesus passed to the glorious resurrection by way of death, we celebrate the liberation of ourselves from sin to holiness, from fear to joy, from death to life, and from pain to gain. Thus, the history of Jesus becomes the mystery of our daily life in this ever-challenging world. By this celebration, we bring death to our sinful nature and rejuvenate resurrection to life in Jesus with total freedom: Our Salvation.

The gospel of this weekend (JN: 20:1-9) brings out a unique theme that summarizes the real meaning of ‘tombs and resurrections’ in our life. The word ‘Tomb’ is mentioned 7 times (Seven is a biblical number). These seven tombs represent the seven deadly sins which are the ‘tombs’ of our spiritual life: pride, greed, envy, wrath, lust, gluttony, and sloth. There are seven corresponding seven virtues that are signs of resurrection in our life: humility, charity, kindness, patience, chastity, temperance, and diligence. Let us remove the stones of denial from the tombs of our spiritual life and let us clothe ourselves with virtues of Joy engendered by the resurrection of Jesus.

During this Easter time let us bury our despair and raise our hope in the resurrection following Jesus, our victor of death and winner of salvation. As a follower of Christ who died on the cross to give us eternal life, we should fill our life with hope of life and faith of joy. We are people of resurrection not of death. Christ has risen from death. Alleluia. We should rise above our fear of uncertainty and live a life of happiness filled with faith in Jesus. We need to come out of our tomb of fear to enjoy the resurrection of our life in Christ.
